Make a list of all the sporting celebrities that you can think of and put them in sporting categories.

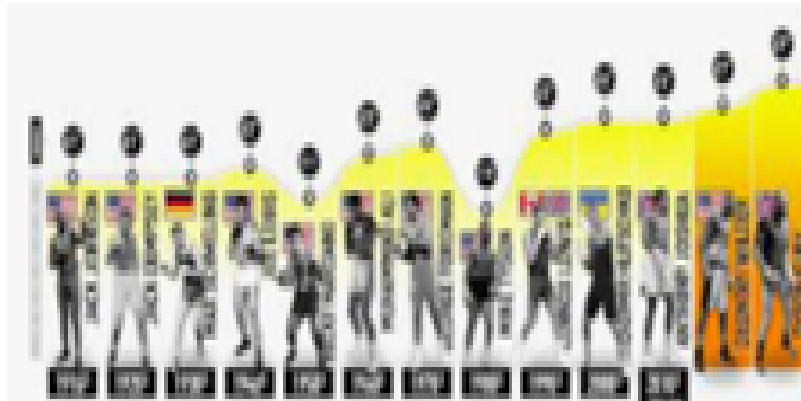


Tally
